

Job Fair






Trevor Wood is our August 2024 Volunteer of the Month and will be recognized on August 6th during our City Council meeting.

Mayor's Newsletter | August 2024



What a great place to live! The City Orchard Days celebration is on. A few changes have been made, yet all the usual celebration events are in order. I hope you have looked at the parade route on 100 south and picked a fine spot to view it from.

The contractors on the Main Street project are not going to interfere with our celebration activities. I hope that you can see they are making great progress on the project.



It has been a tough four months getting through the first phase of the Santaquin Main Street project. We continue to work with the utility companies, the contractor, UDOT and the businesses along the route. There is the remainder of the first phase to finish before the current construction season ends. Then we should have a bit of a breather through the winter.

The majority of the funds to pay for this project are Utah County and State dollars that were awarded five years ago and updated this past December. Santaquin dollars are just a small percentage of the funding. We continue to work to ensure the job is completed correctly, within specification, and within budget.

Next year will be the continuation of the project with phase two from 100 west to near the UDOT shed. With phase two we feel it will move smoothly, on schedule, and within budget.

I hope you all have been and continue to support our downtown businesses. For me, it has not been difficult to drive to a convenient parking area and gain access to these businesses during this construction. Please continue to support the great people and the work they do to make our life better.



I am still hoping for a little more rain and cooler temperatures as the last month of summer is upon us. May each of you have a great summer. May we all have the best time this year as we support the Santaquin Orchard Days celebration and especially attend the Rodeo.
