I am hoping you are all getting ready for the fall colors and one of our best falls in years!

Since March, we have been engaged with construction on Main Street. I want to report that the project is on schedule and we continue to plan for the completion of the first four blocks on time and on budget. We have found opportunities to even provide some extra effort to take care of needed replacement of an old culinary water line that will correct a problem before it becomes a failure. A big thanks to our Engineering and Public Works crews for suggestions and ideas to help our City operate even better.

This year, I have been working closely with UDOT on the I-15 Santaquin Main Street interchange Environmental Assessment (EA). They have assessed current and future traffic conditions, along with all required federal elements that are part of the EA. Feedback received during February's public comment period and other data has helped UDOT develop solutions for the safety and congestion issues that many of us experience daily at the Main Street interchange. I'm happy with the partnership the City has fostered with UDOT, and how responsive UDOT has been to our concerns.

Santaquin residents will have the opportunity to attend a public hearing later this year for UDOT's I-15 Santaquin Environmental Assessment study findings and recommendations. At the public hearing, citizens can learn more about the preferred alternative, ask questions, and submit formal comments. Please plan to attend and to be a part of Santaquin's growth going forward, with solutions to our traffic issues.

My hope is that the community will attend the public hearing and submit a comment during the accompanying comment period. Thank you to everyone who participated in the previous public comment period. The UDOT team is excited to hear from you again.

Lastly, the work on the Santaquin Canyon road is planned to finish in a few weeks. We do not have an opening date yet, but the canyon looks great. They began the asphalt the last of August and are moving on to installing the new guard rails soon.

What a treasure Santaquin Canyon is to each of us. I hope you all get a chance to visit the canyon and see what we have all been missing for the past 6 years. Santaquin is such a great place to live!
