SECTION 2: This Resolution shall become effective upon passage.

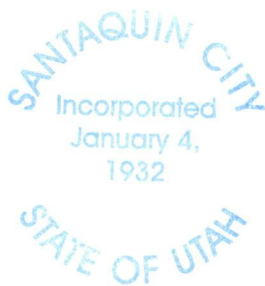

AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made and entered into by and between Utah County, a political subdivision of the State of Utah, with its office located at 100 East Center Street, Provo, Utah, 84606, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY and SANTAQUIN CITY, located at 275 West Main Street, Santaquin, Utah ,84655, hereinafter referred to as CITY.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners, Utah County, Utah has adopted policy guidelines and procedures for approving applications for Utah County Community Activities Fund grants which comply with the provisions of Title 59, Chapter 12, Part 6, Utah Code Annotated, 1953 as amended, and

WHEREAS, COUNTY has reviewed the Utah County Community Activities Grant application submitted by CITY and has determined that CITY should be awarded a Utah County Community Activities Grant;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants set forth herein, it is agreed by and between COUNTY and CITY as follows:

1. COUNTY hereby agrees to make a Utah County Community Activities Grant to CITY in an amount not to exceed \$5,458.35 through funds derived from the Tourism, Recreation, Cultural and Convention Facilities Tax of the County of Utah for improvements to CITY'S Rodeo Arena, specifically improvements to the roping facilities.

2. CITY hereby agrees that the grant received from COUNTY shall be used exclusively in funding the above-mentioned project.

3. The parties agree that all funds granted by COUNTY to CITY shall be given only for documented reimbursable costs incurred by CITY for the purpose stated above, and that payments by COUNTY to CITY will be made only upon presentation by CITY to COUNTY of appropriate receipts or other permitted documentation of reimbursable costs made by CITY. Presentation of all said appropriate receipts or other permitted documentation shall be made to COUNTY prior to October 31, 2016. No reimbursement for any costs submitted after October 31, 2016 will be made by COUNTY to CITY.

4. CITY also agrees that all publicity generated by CITY for the above-mentioned approved project shall display the language, "Sponsored in part by the Utah County Community Activities Fund."

5. The parties agree that COUNTY by virtue of this Agreement is making a grant only to CITY and is not responsible for any actions of CITY, or any other entity, in the construction of the project and the completion of the project stated above.

6. It is agreed by the parties that COUNTY may audit the records of CITY concerning the above-mentioned approved project at any time.

7. It is agreed by the parties that this Agreement shall be governed by, construed, and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Utah.

8. This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties and any prior understanding or representation of any kind preceding the date of this Agreement shall not be binding upon either party except to the extent incorporated in this Agreement

9. Any modification of this Agreement or additional obligation assumed by either party in connection with this Agreement shall be binding only if placed in writing and signed by each party or an authorized representative of each party.





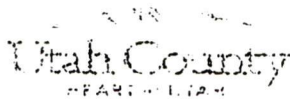

Project Description: Rodeo Arena Improvements

The Santaquin Rodeo Arena is a 6.22 acre facility located at 200 South 400 West. The facility includes a 39,000 sq ft arena, with five (5) bucking chutes and a holding pen for rough stock, an announcer's stand, roping chutes, a stock return alley, a small holding/warm-up pen, parking area and spectator area.

Equestrian activities are a large part of life in Santaquin. The facility is currently used by youth 4-H Clubs, local riding and rodeo clubs, and for special events such as the Orchard Days and Little Buckaroo rodeos. Residents have access to the facility on a first come first serve basis on days/nights when it is not reserved. The facility is in high demand from March to October.

Each year Santaquin City organizes an amateur rodeo in conjunction with the city Orchard Days celebration. Over the past few years the rodeo has noticeably grown; not only in the number of spectators that attend, but the number of participants as well. Santaquin City has made several improvement to the arena in the past using Utah County Municipal Grant funds, including improving the announcers stand, electrical upgrades, and adding bucking chutes and holding pens for the rough stock events.

Due in part to these facility upgrades the Orchard Days Rodeo has attracted some of the best amateur cowboys over the past 7-8 year. This rodeo has become very popular and is considered, a favorite, among the amateur circuit participants. Participants come from all over the state and look forward to the Orchard Days Rodeo each year. In fact, the Santaquin Orchards Day's Rodeo has been voted "Rodeo of the Year" by the Rocky Mountain Rodeo Association (RMPRA) in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, and 2014.

In order to continue to provide a quality event each year, provide nice facilities for those groups and organizations currently using the facility and attract other private groups or organizations to our facility, additional improvements will need to be made each year. Enhancing facilities used for roping events, including calf roping, team roping, breakaway and steer wrestling is next on the list.

Santaquin city proposes using the 2016 Utah County Municipal Recreation Grant in the amount of \$5,458.35 to replace deteriorating roping chute and some of the rusting panels in the return alley. The total cost to this project is \$5,463.06 (see attached cost estimate). All labor and installation will be provided and donated by the local Rodeo Club.

Community Benefits

Our community, our health, our economy and our environment all benefit from investments in local parks and recreation facilities. The effective delivery of these services provides many benefits (specific and general) to the community including:

Specific Benefits:

- Continuing to provide essential facilities for those wanting to explore equestrian opportunities and improve equestrian skills.
- Continuing to provide upgraded facilities to rodeo participants, 4H club members, rodeo club members, residents and those renting the facility for private events.
- Increased revenue to Recreation Department. Upgraded roping facilities will potentially draw more private entities to rent the facility rodeo events.
- Continuing a great Santaquin tradition of having one of the best amateur rodeos in the State of Utah.

General Benefits:

- Recreation facilities/parks develop a sense of community pride and enhance the quality of life. When citizens get involved with recreation programs and community events, their quality of life improves. Parks and recreation opportunities encourage citizens to be engaged in their communities as volunteers, advocates and participants.
- Access to recreation facilities/parks leads to healthy lifestyles for people of all ages. Activities in parks and recreational facilities can build self-esteem, reduce stress and improve overall wellness.
- Recreation facilities/parks play a key role in preserving water and enhancing air quality.

Conclusion

A strong park and recreation system is essential for a thriving community. Santaquin City is committed to providing recreation activities, facilities, open space and general amenities to its residents in the most cost-effective manner possible and will continue to strive towards enhancing the quality of life for all residents.
